Bernhard Corr is head of division “deNIS” (German Emergency Preparedness Information System) of the Federal Office for Civil Protection and Disaster Response (BBK). The German Emergency Preparedness Information System is an information and communication System to support the crisis management during large-scale disasters.

Mr. Corr was born in 1952 in Aachen, Germany. After school he joined the German Air Force and graduated as Air Defence Officer. After that he worked as Air Defence Fighter Controller in a NATO Air Defence Control Centre. In 1979 he changed to the Federal Office for Civil Defence in a position of an Air Defence Liaison Officer. As liaison officer for the Federal Office he was responsible for the assessment of the air situation which was presented in the NATO Air Defence Centres. Afterwards he worked in several positions in the division of “warning of population”. In 2001 the Federal Office assigned him the responsibility to design the German Emergency Preparedness Information System as a project director. After the Systems’ development and start up in 2006 the Federal Office entrusted him as head of division of the German Emergency Preparedness Information System. In this function he is responsible for the operation and the further development of “deNIS”.
